Answer: No, because all residual work with respect to an evaluation work of the Elan project started in the previous year has been completed. Further streamlining of costs will be implemented. It is expected that cost will be significantly reduced in the next two quarters. The Company will continue to focus on stakeholder consultation.

2. Has the entity taken any steps, or does it propose to take any steps, to raise further cash to fund its operations and, if so, what are those steps and how likely does it believe that they will be successful?

Answer: In addition to significantly reducing the costs within the organisation, the Company is expected to receive \$422k as refund of expenses from JOGMEC and \$126k refund in GST in the first quarter of 2022.

3. Does the entity expect to be able to continue its operations and to meet its business objectives and, if so, on what basis?

Answer: Based on forecast expenditure and available cash (including the funds to be received as mentioned in 2. above, the Company expects to be able to continue its operations and meet its significantly reduced business objectives.
